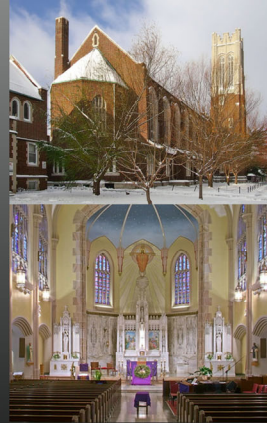

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace! I hope these words find you well in the Lord. **This weekend we bid farewell to Deacon Bob Hennekes.** Deacon Bob has been with us since the middle of the month of May serving our parish family with great joy and enthusiasm. In our first reading this weekend, we hear from the Book of the Prophet Amos. Now, I greatly admire this particular prophet. The words of St. Teresa of Calcutta come to mind when I think of him: “God has not called me to be successful. He called me to be faithful.”

It’s interesting, we don’t know too many details about the life of Amos. Actually, a lot of what we know comes from our first reading. He “was a shepherd and a dresser of sycamores” called by God to prophesy to the Northern Kingdom (Amos 7:14-15). Nonetheless, Amos’ character shines through rather brilliantly. In Amos, you have a simple, ordinary man called by God to an extraordinary task: to stand before a king, a high priest, and a people, and basically, preach their demise, their future destruction. In addition to this, God informs him that his words are, basically, going to fall on deaf ears. How about that for a mission? Amos, though, is not deterred. He remains faithful, so rooted is he in his relationship and trust in God. He knows God has a plan and this keeps him steadfast in his calling... Truly remarkable!

I pray that we as a parish family continue to remain steadfast in our call to faithful discipleship. Like the prophet Amos, may we not be disheartened through the struggles we face, but always look confidently to the Lord to lead us along the path of our salvation. God bless and keep you always! My prayers remain for you all!

NEW PARISH "NAME PROPOSAL"

Corpus Christi

(Submitted by Sister Carlene Welker, D.C.)

"The Church of God" is "the People." During this Eucharistic Year of Renewal and the year of "All Things New", I would like to submit the name of "*Corpus Christi*". (We the People – The Church of the Body of Christ)."



FEAST OF CORPUS CHRISTI

"The feast of Corpus Christi was proposed by Thomas Aquinas, Doctor of the Church, to Pope Urban IV, in order to create a feast focused solely on the Holy Eucharist, emphasizing the joy of the Eucharist being the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. Having recognized in 1264 the authenticity of the Eucharistic Miracle of Bolsena*, on input of Aquinas, the pontiff, then living in Orvieto, established the feast of Corpus Christi as a Solemnity and extended it to the whole Roman Catholic Church. The feast is liturgically celebrated on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday or, 'where the Solemnity of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is not a holy day of obligation, it is assigned to the Sunday after the Most Holy Trinity as its proper day'.

At the end of Holy Mass, there is often a procession of the Blessed Sacrament, generally displayed in a monstrance. The procession is followed by the Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. A notable Eucharistic procession is that presided over by the Pope each year in Rome, where it begins at the Archbasilica of St. John Lateran and passes to the Basilica of Saint Mary Major, where it concludes with the aforementioned Benediction. Corpus Christi wreaths, which are made of flowers, are hung on the doors and windows of the Christian faithful, in addition to being erected in gardens and fields."

Eucharistic Miracle of Bolsena

*"The Corporal of Bolsena dates from a Eucharistic miracle in Bolsena, Italy, in 1263 when a consecrated host began to bleed onto a corporal, the small cloth upon which the host and chalice rest during the Canon of the Mass. The appearance of blood was seen as a miracle to affirm the Roman Catholic doctrine of transubstantiation, which states that the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ at the moment of consecration during the Mass. Today the Corporal of Bolsena is preserved in a rich reliquary at Orvieto in the cathedral.



The reddish spots on the cloth, upon close observation, show the profile of a face similar to those that traditionally represent Jesus Christ. It is said that the miraculous bleeding of the host occurred in the hands of an officiating priest who had doubts about transubstantiation, Peter of Prague."
